#### GENERAL RULES ENTRY INFORMATION

- 1. All entry cards and tags are available at the Colorado County Ag Extension Office (979) 732-2082.
- 2. All articles entered must be labeled with the appropriate tag. The tag must contain the classification of article and name of article. Entry cards must be completed by the exhibitor and have the appropriate signature for the youth division. No multiple participant entries allowed. Only single participant entry accepted unless otherwise designated.
- 3. DO NOT MIX CATEGORIES. PLACE ONE CATEGORY ON A TAG. (Example: all category A items on one card.) Only one item per class (Ex. A1).
- 4. All Exhibits must be in excellent condition, very clean, well pressed, and odor free or they will not be accepted. All exhibits must be made by the exhibitor, and only one entry per class will be accepted. Division chairmen have the authority and responsibility to disqualify items that are dirty, soiled or do not appear to have been made or completed within the last year.
- 5. It is unethical to exhibit items that have been previously exhibited or made by anyone other than the exhibitor, and such items will be disqualified and removed from exhibition.
- 6. NO duplicate items will be accepted in miscellaneous categories. Items may be entered as miscellaneous only if they do not qualify in listed classes.
- 7. All exhibitors are required to place cell phone numbers on entry cards along with home phone numbers to provide better communication.
- 8. Artwork eligible for judging cannot be completed prior to January of the same Fair year (2022.)
- 9. Artwork minimum size 8x10; maximum artwork for Jr. High and High School size 11x14. Any questions, please call the Extension Office at 979-732-2082 during normal business hours prior to September 1, 2023.
- 10. All artwork turned in for judging must be dry.
- 11. Age Division are as follows:
  - a. Youth Junior Ages 4-8
  - b. Youth Intermediate Ages 9-13
  - c. Youth Senior Ages 14-19
  - d. Adult Ages 20 and Older
  - e. Assisted Living

Note: Each age division will compete separately unless specified otherwise.

#### 12. Each youth that enters more than 10 quality items will receive a carnival pass.

#### **ENTRY FEES**

An entry fee of \$2.00 per item will be charged for 1-10 items, for 11-50 items \$20.00 per exhibitor will be charged. Maximum of 50 items per exhibitor. Adults may have an additional ten (10) items in the Adult Flower Show.

- 1. All articles will be accepted from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 12, 2023.
- 2. Although precautions will be taken, the Colorado County Fair Association and volunteers will not be responsible for items lost, stolen, broken, or damaged.
- 3. All articles must be tagged and properly labeled before entrance into the exhibit building.

#### CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Items on display in the exhibition hall will not be released until 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 16, 2023, and Sunday, September 17, 2023, from 8:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. In addition, all items left after 10:30 a.m. on the date of check out will no longer be the responsibility of the Colorado County Fair or its affiliated partners. Items removed prior to scheduled removal time will forfeit all prize money. Exhibitors are welcome to recycle any ribbons or rosettes if they so desire.

#### SCORING

- 1. Judging will begin at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, September 13, 2023, for all categories.
- 2. One (1) Grand Champion entry and one (1) Reserve Champion entry may be selected from each category in each division in each department if warranted by the judges. Categories with less than three (3) items will only be awarded placement ribbons and appropriate prize money.
- 3. The judge's decision is final.
- 4. Judges are requested to write a comment on the back of the tag when awarding a red ribbon.

#### YOUTH HIGH POINT CONTEST

- 1. A High Point Awards Contest will be held for youth in the Homemaking Department.
- 2. First, second and third place high point awards will be awarded to youth in each age division: Junior, Intermediate, and Senior.
- 3. Awards include: First Place TBD and \$25 Second Place TBD and \$15 Third Place \$10
- 4. Youth must enter at least **10 QUALITY** items in the Homemaking Department to qualify for points.

5. Winners will be selected on a point system. Points will be awarded as follows:
Grand Champion – 6 points Reserve Champion – 5 points Best of Section – 4 points Blue Ribbon – 3 points Red Ribbon - 2 points

#### CANNED FOODS CATEGORY - 3 SECTION - C

All canned foods do not need a label, just an entry tag. The level of jar contents must be ¼" to ½" from the top of the jar lid. Low acid canned food items (items in pressure canner) need to have 1" headspace. All jars must be clean and shiny with rings removed. Canning can be done in only a standard canning jar (Mason, Ball, Kerr, etc.) – salad dressing or other such jars are not allowed. Fruit, vegetables, fruit pickles, and vegetable pickles – pieces in jars should be uniform in size and product should not be floating. Jelly must be firm, but not hard or with visible sugar crystals. It must pull away clean from the side of the jar and still hold its shape. Fruit or vegetable juice must be bright and have a clear color. It should not be cloudy. Quality canned items do not have air pockets or bubbles among the vegetable or fruit pieces. **\*Categories with less than three (3) entries will receive placement ribbons only.**

#### BAKED GOODS CATEGORY - 4 SECTION – D

Due to limited space please see rule #9 in general rules on page 7 Cakes, breads and pies must have two identical, completed entry tags for each item. Baked cakes and bread will be judged as the whole product. Other baked items must be placed on a 6" disposable plate and placed in a clear plastic zip lock bag to be accepted. No decorations such as ribbons, doilies, etc. All cakes and bread should be picked up by 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, September 17, 2023. Grand and Reserve winners will leave ¼ of the cake or bread for display, you may pick up the remaining portion. All cakes and breads not picked up by 1:00 p.m. will be disposed of. All cakes must be on a sturdy, disposable sheet of cardboard no larger than 1" from the edge of the decorated item which has been covered with aluminum foil or white paper. Glass plates will not be accepted.

#### The fair is not responsible for any damage due to climate control.

If siblings are competing against one another in the same division (example – a brother and sister both bake brownies in the 4-H Junior Division), it would be to their advantage to modify the recipe if possible. For example, if one enters a brownie, the other should enter brownies with nuts. By doing this, the entries will be easier to distinguish.

KING ARTHUR CATEGORY - 5 SECTION – E

Entries will be accepted Tuesday, September 12, 2023, from 10:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. NO early release of exhibits.

#### SPECIAL RULES

- 1. Items in this Division must be made with King Arthur Flour.
- 2. Exhibitors must bring the opened bag King Arthur Flour with them or the UPC label from the flour bag when he/she submits the entry.
- 3. All pies must be at least 9 inches in diameter.
- 4. All loaves of bread must be in a plastic bag and must be a minimum of 4" x 8" size.
- 5. All other entries must be on a disposable firm base such as foil-covered cardboard, aluminum pie pan, paper plate, etc. and covered with a transparent plastic wrap or zip lock bag where appropriate.
- 6. All cookies, candies, rolls, biscuits, doughnuts, etc. entered must consist of 15 items with three of the items wrapped separately and attached to the top of the entry by exhibitor.
- 7. No entry should be cut prior to judging. After judging, one slice must remain on display. The remainder will be sold as a donation to the fair.
- 8. NO baked goods will be accepted that require refrigeration.

**NOTES:** Items will be judged on appearance (uniformity, color, shape), texture (appropriate for each item), and taste.

#### HORTICULTURE CATEGORY – 6 SECTION – F

Entries will be accepted Tuesday, September 12, 2023, from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Specimen entries will be Wednesday, September 13, 2023, from 7:30 to 9:00 a.m. Judging will be held on September 13th at 9:30am. Entries will be released Saturday at 11:00 p.m. NO early release of exhibits.

**NOTE** – Specimens will be judged on cultural perfection (form, color substance, abundance of bloom, size according to variety foliage and stems).

**<u>CUT SPECIMENS</u>** - will be judged on cultural perfection, size according to variety, color, form, substance or texture of bloom and/or foliage.

**POTTED PLANTS** - will be judged on cultural perfection, size according to variety, color, form, substance or texture of bloom and/or foliage.

**<u>FLORAL DESIGN</u>** - will be judged on outline of design, smooth lines, focal point, size and types of plant materials, visual balance/stability, color, construction and workmanship and size, shape, color and material of container.

**PLANTS IN UNUSUAL CONTAINERS** - will be judged on general appearance, size according to variety (balance), color, form, substance, or texture appropriate and uniqueness of container.

#### SPECIAL RULES

- 1. All plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 90 days or more prior to the Fair.
- 2. Cut specimens must be displayed in a clear bottle. The stems must be in the water. There should not be any foliage in the water, only the stem.
- 3. All entries must have the COMMON NAME of the plant on the exhibitor tag.
- 4. Only amateur growers will be eligible to exhibit.
- 5. Any plant deemed unworthy of an award will be disqualified by the chairperson of the division. No artificial plants accepted.
- 6. Each exhibitor is responsible for the grooming/care and watering of his/her plants.
- 7. ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE FREE OF DIRT DISEASE AND INSECTS.
- 8. Exhibits not complying will be disqualified.
- 9. If a potted flowering plant is not actively flowering, then it needs to be shown in the potted foliage plant category.

#### **Definitions:**

Dish Garden – Miniature Landscape in an open low-volume shallow container.

**<u>Terrarium</u>** – A miniature landscape in a container with high transparent sides. The top may be closed or open.

<u>Wedging</u> – Inserting a small piece of material, e.g., sprig of evergreen, a bit of wood or a piece of plastic wrap, in the neck of an exhibit bottle to hold a cut specimen in its proper pose.

#### **FLOWER SHOW/SPECIMEN**

The name of the plant must be entered on the entry card. All plants must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor at least 90 days prior to the Fair. All containers must be clean and attractive. Plants should be watered no later than 24 hours before exhibition. Plants and containers may weigh no more than 15 pounds. A scale will be available, and the 15 pounds rule will be enforced. No black pots, double pots, or wrappings.

#### SPECIAL RULES

- 1. There is an entry fee of \$2.00 per collection.
- 2. There can only be one (1) entry per exhibitor.
- 3. Collectible exhibits cannot be entered in consecutive years.
- 4. Each exhibit will be given a maximum of <u>36 inches</u> in which to set up a display. The collection MUST have been collected and entered by said exhibitor.

**NOTE:** Displays will be judged on attractiveness of display and originality. (Please limit your items to avoid overcrowding.)

- 1. Professional/ Commercial/ Master quilters mean one who has pieced or quilted for monetary gain, taught any quilt-making technique for monetary gain, published a book or pattern, or had a quilt selected for publication in a book or magazine.
- 2. In all quilt categories, if a second person quilted the item, please note "Quilted By" and the name of the quilter on the entry tag.
- 3. If the item consists of an original design by the exhibitor, please note "Original Design" on the entry tag.
- 4. Stitches should be even, neat and have appropriate tensions, knots or thread ends should be hidden and no loose threads, quilts show be attractive, clean, and creative, no obvious signs of stretching or distortion of design shape, batting should be even, and corners should be smooth.
- 5. Definition of quilt a quilt has three layers: top, middle, and backing.
- 6. A maximum of three quilts entered.

#### PHOTOGRAPHY CATEGORY – 11 SECTION – J

#### SPECIAL RULES:

1. An entry fee of \$2.00 will be charged for each adult photograph entered. The entry fee for youth is \$2.00 per photograph. There will be a limit of five (5) photographs per person. There are 4 divisions:

**Division A – Youth** – Those who take photographs for their own pleasure and have not received money for their photography who are age 19 or younger. Married person aged 19 or younger must enter an adult section.

**Division B – Amateur** – Those who take photographs for their own pleasure and have not received money for their photography and who are age 20 or older.

**Division C – Professional** – Those who derive personal income from professional photography or photographic services such as teaching, processing, printing or print finishing.

**Division D – Amateur, Pro-Enhanced/Altered/Special Effects** – Consult rules below for specific criteria and guidelines on photographs that require they be entered in this section.

- 2. The Photography Contest is open to residents and property owners of Colorado County and to youth attending school within the county.
- 3. Photographs exhibited in previous years are not eligible to be entered.
- 4. Entries will be limited to color or black and white prints only. Prints from film or digital cameras will be accepted.
- 5. Entries should be printed on regular standard quality photo paper. The use of specialize photography paper which enhances the print requires such an entry to be entered in Division D.
- 6. It is recommended that adult contestants use lab processing rather than making prints on a home computer. Judges take into account the overall quality of the print. It is also recommended that in the three adult divisions, photos with a date printed on them be cropped or matted to eliminate or conceal the date.
- 7. Cropping for effect is permitted in all 4 divisions. Minimal light adjustments (lightening or darkening) of the original photo are permitted in Division A through C.
- 8. Any photo digitally or computer enhanced or altered by dropping or adding elements, intensification of colors, removal of shadows or any other alteration or enhancement other than those permitted in rule #7, must be entered in Division D. Any photo taken to create a special effect by the use of special techniques such as antiquing, sepia-tone, hand tinting or any other special effect, enhancement or alteration, other than those permitted in rule #7, must be entered in Division D.
- 9. Frames are not permitted except in Division C Professional.
- 10. Youth entries must not be altered or enhanced other than those changes permitted in rule #7. Prints should be 5" x 7" in size. They must be mounted on white or colored poster board to a finished size of 6" x 8". No hanging apparatus is needed.
- 11. Amateur entries should be 8" x 10" and must be matted to a finished size of 11" x 14". No hanging apparatus is needed.
- 12. Professional entries should be no larger than 10" x 13" before matting or framing. Matted entries do not need hanging apparatus. Framed entries need a secure hook or wire affixed to the back for hanging.
- 13. Amateur and Professional entries in Division D should be no larger than 8" x 10" and must be matted to a finished size of 11" x 14". No frames permitted. No hanging apparatus is needed.

- 14. Special rule for all photographs entered in "Spirit of the Fair" class: the exhibitor must agree to allow the Colorado County Fair Association, Inc. to use his or her photo for publicity on posters or in fair programs, catalogs, newspaper articles and the like, without compensation, if the Fair Association so desires. The photographer's name would be acknowledged in the publication.
- 15. All entries will be judged and awarded a blue or red ribbon. At the discretion of the judges, a Best of Section will be chosen from among the blue ribbons in Divisions A and B. In Division A and B, a Best of Show and Reserve Best of Show will be chosen from among the Best of Section winners. In Divisions C and D, a Best of Show and Reserve Best of Show will be chosen from among the blue-ribbon winners. The contest chairman has the right to recategorize photographs where no competition exists.
- 16. Each youth age division will compete separately. These age divisions are:

Youth Primary – up to 8 years

Youth Junior – 9 to 13 years

Youth Senior – 14 to 19 years

- 18. Photographs will be accepted in Founders Hall at the Fairgrounds on Tuesday, September 12, 2023, from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m.
- 19. Judging and Removal: Judging will begin at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday, September 13, 2023. Founders Hall will be closed to the public until 4 p.m. on Thursday. All work must remain on exhibit until 3 p.m. Sunday, September 17, 2023, no early release. All entries will be removed from the exhibition at Founders Hall and must be picked up by 9 a.m. on Sunday, September 17. Any entries not picked up by 10 a.m. Sunday will be taken on Monday to the County Extension Office at 316 Spring Street for pickup during normal business hours. Photographs of winners of Best of Show and Reserve Best of Show in all 4 divisions will be taken in Founders Hall at 3 p.m. on Saturday, September 16, 2023.

- 1. All entries are subject to the General Rules of the Colorado County Fair.
- 2. Entries will be received Tuesday, September 12, 2023, from 10:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m.
- 3. All artwork submitted must have been made by January 2023.
- 4. Only one (1) piece of artwork per person will be accepted.
- 5. All exhibits in this department must be labeled, given name, address/school, and exhibitor division.
- 6. Exhibitor divisions are:
  - Coloring Clipart (provided by CCF): pre-K and Kindergartner
  - Open: adult (non-professional), high school, junior high and youth
  - School Art: high school, junior high, elementary
- 7. Entry Regulations: NO Plagiarism allowed! Published images MAY NOT be reproduced in whole or part. Published images include, but are not limited to, drawings, sketches or photographs published electronically (eBooks, mobile apps, web sites, etc.) or in print (magazines, books, brochures, etc.). No trademark logos, licensed characters, or any other copyrighted image. However, any listed may be used as reference material.

**No obscenity allowed!** No profane references to a deity, obscene language, drug abuse or paraphernalia, images that are violent or any content that may offend the moral standards of the community.

- 8. Acceptable medium: Pencils (graphite, colored, charcoal), pressed crayon, pastels (chalk, oil), paints (tempera, acrylic, watercolors, oil), inks (pen & ink, printmaking, graffito), paper (collage). \*All loose materials must be 'fixed' with a spray fixative.
- 9. Size of Work: Adult, High School, Junior High ages maximum overall dimensions of mounted artwork cannot exceed 24" x 24". Elementary and preschool ages artwork cannot exceed 9"x12"; mounted with no more than a 1" border (example: mount the 11"x14" art piece on a half (1/2) sheet poster board; final measurement will be 11"x14" including a 1" border.)
- 10. Artwork must be mounted or matted with white or black mounts/mats; no liners or additional inner mats allowed. Un-mounted artwork will not be accepted by judges.
- 11. Artwork must have at least two Velcro dots on the back (this is to display artwork on carpet display wall.)
- 12. All artwork needs to be unframed. Canvas board/stretched canvas artwork needs to have a tab attached to each top corner so that the artwork can be hung on the display board.
- 13. Do not put your signature on the front of your artwork.
- 14. Awards:
  - Elementary School Art: One (1) "Best of Show" and "Reserved Best of Show" will be awarded to grades Pre-K thru 3 and grades 4 thru 5.
  - Junior High School Art (6th, 7th, and 8th): One (1) "Best of Show" and "Reserved Best of Show" awarded per campus.
  - High School Art (9th, 10th, and 11th): One (1) "Best of Show" and "Reserved Best of Show" will be awarded.

- **Open Adult:** One (1) "Best of Show" and "Reserved Best of Show" will be awarded.
- **Open Youth:** One (1) "Best of Show" and "Reserved Best of Show" will be awarded.
